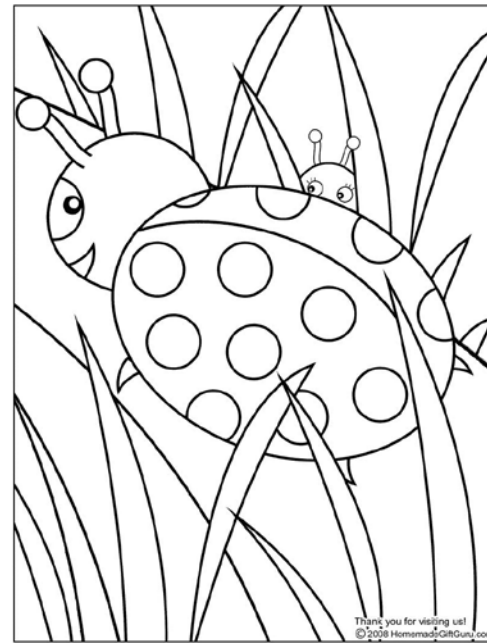

26. Variety of Minus earth

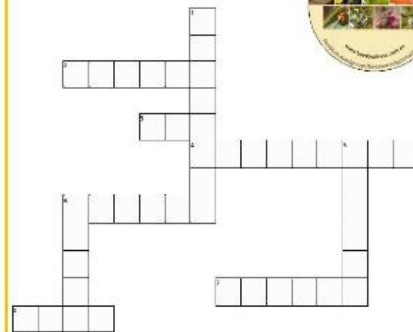
