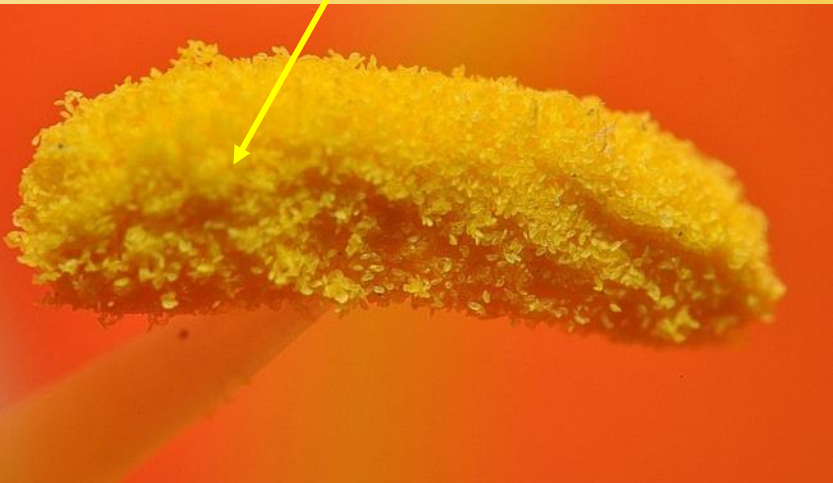

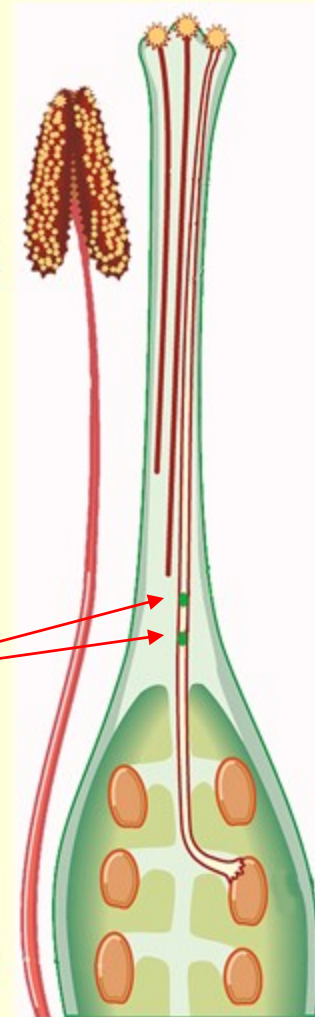
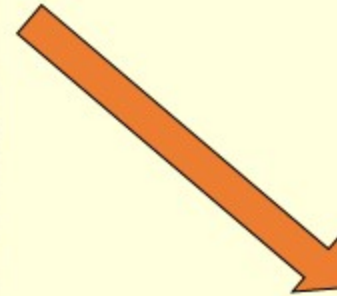
Stigmatic surface

Pollen grains on anther





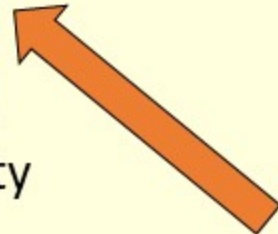

Seed set & fruit tissue growth



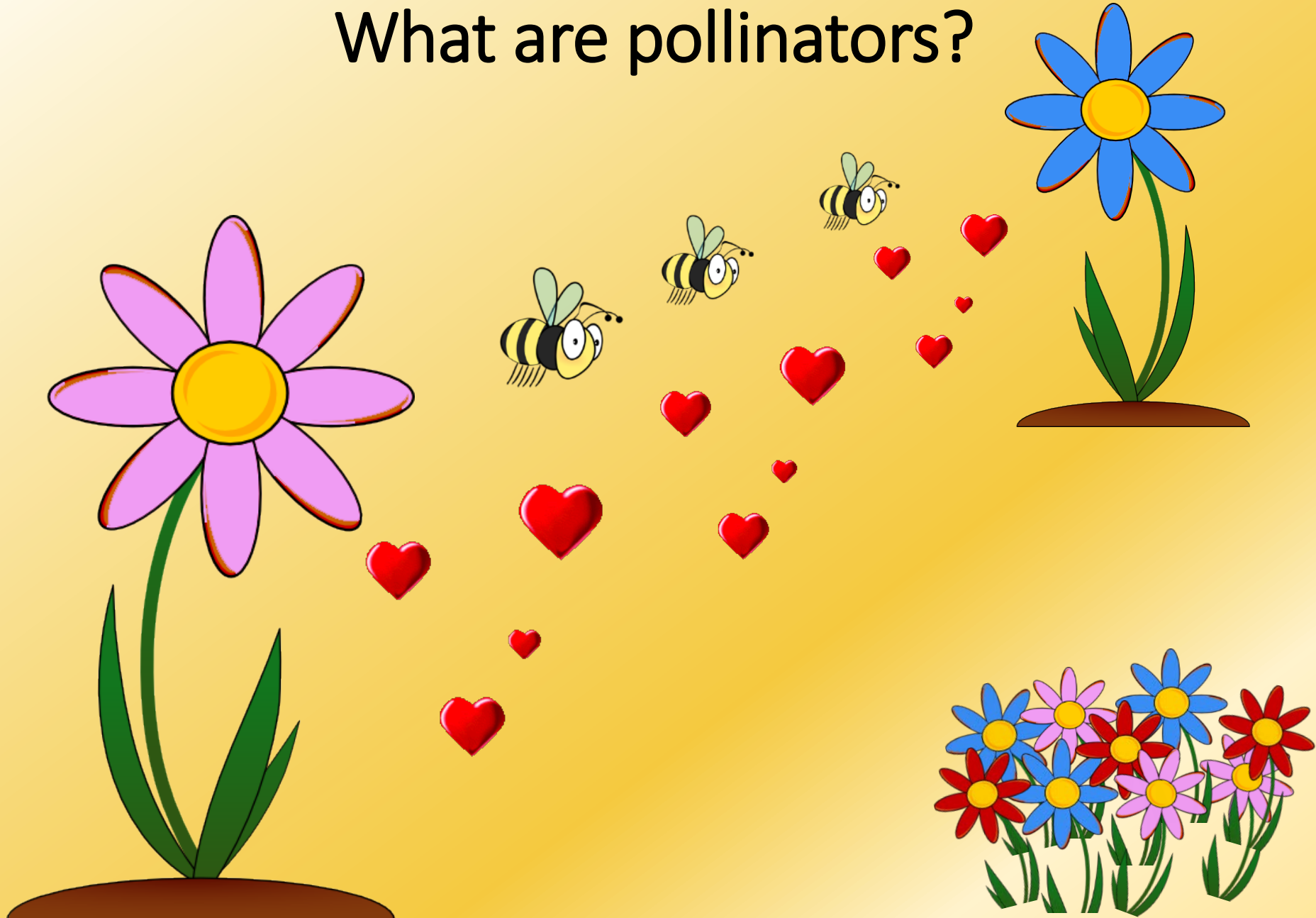
